WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP COUNCIL MEETING – FEBRUARY 4, 2020

CALL TO Mayor Patterson called the Washington Township Council Meeting to order on February 4, 2020 at 7:00 **ORDER** P.M. at the Washington Township Administration Building at 11800 Edinboro Road, Edinboro, PA 16412. Those present were Vice-Mayor Feikles, Councilmen Renick, Councilpersons Campbell and Laythe. Also present were Manager Anthony, Community Development Specialist Deborah Anthony and Zoning Officer Willow. Visitors were Rick Chernicky, Karen Renick, Mark Eisert, Jeremy Peterson and Chris Gerhart.

AGENDA It was voted on motion by Campbell, seconded by Renick, to approve the Agenda as presented. **APPROVAL** Motion carried unanimously.

COUNCIL <u>It was voted</u> on motion by Feikles, seconded by Renick, to approve the Minutes of the semi-MINUTES monthly Council Meeting of January 20, 2020. <u>Motion carried unanimously.</u>

TREASURER'S The following checks presented for approval: General Fund #18790-18834, Water Fund #6102-**REPORT** 6111, Sewer Fund #7934-7946, and payroll checks #16631-16640, (Water) 10076 and (Sewer)10182.

SECRETARY'S REPORT Manager Anthony presented following report:

Amazingly enough the month of January didn't give us much of a challenge with the winter weather any more than December did. We had only one major event and just a handful of smaller ones. Although the weather has been quite wet, soaking the ground, our roads have fared well. We have been right on top of any potholes that may have appeared. Even those have been minimal up until this point. The lack of snow has allowed for some much needed rehabilitation work to be performed on our aging bucket loader. The crew also built and installed the western style sign for the entrance to Inspiration Park. I want to personally thank them for a job well done. With at least one more month or more of potentially heavy winter weather we will remain vigilant and prepared. Both our salt and antiskid use has been minimal and may be a cost savings along with the lesser amounts of overtime for this season.

The Sewer Department reports no major problems as of this correspondence. We are still waiting on the repairs to the lift station PLC that was previously reported on. We do anticipate that to be completed in the near future.

After some long search and destroy tactics, our Water Department and a team member from Verizon were able to finally track down the source of the ongoing telemetry problem. It appears that several small factors were the possible contributors to this predicament. Cracks in some aging wires and some poor connections at various locations throughout the wiring system appears to the culprits. The weather during the last full weekend in January would have typically been a source of a major malfunction of that system, but problems were reported. Let's hope that we have overcome that one, at least for a while.

Inspiration and Wainer Parks have been busy during the short times of good snow cover. The skiing community is embracing the program and has had some good visitation. We continue to visualize future winter activities for the parks and how we can promote them to the community at large.

Manager Anthony verbally commented on the annual audit that should be completed soon.
